MAJ Sharletta K. Mahone has served DeKalb County citizens and Solicitor-General Donna Coleman-Stribling as a prosecutor in the Special Victims Unit for over a year. She was recently commissioned as a Major in the Georgia Army National Guard. MAJ Mahone is also the Brigade Judge Advocate for the 78th Aviation Troop Command for the Georgia Army National Guard. In 2011, Mahone was federally commissioned as a first lieutenant in the Georgia Army National Guard as a Judge Advocate. Mahone has served as the Trial Counsel for the 78th Troop Command, HHD 201st Regional Support Group and HHC 648th Maneuver Enhancement Brigade (MEB).

Mahone's military decorations include the Joint Service Achievement Medal, Army Reserve Components Achievement Medal, Army Reserve Components Overseas Training Ribbon, National Defense Service Medal, and Army Service Ribbon. Additionally, she has received a Florida State Commendation Medal, Georgia State Commendation Medal, Georgia State Humanitarian Service Award and Georgia State Active Duty Ribbon.

In service to the country she will be deployed to Kosovo for six months.
